



Applications for SANCOLD Scholarship for Master's Studies in Dam Engineering: 2010-2011

SANCOLD scholarships will assist Master's students to undertake studies and research in the general field of Dam Engineering and to take advantage of the best possible training opportunities in South Africa. These scholarships will allow the holders mobility, as well as the freedom to select supervisors in their chosen fields. The purpose of these scholarships is to support persons who are committed to contributing significantly to research, teaching and professional practice in the field of Dam Engineering in their future careers.

Eligibility:

Applications for a scholarship for Master's studies may be submitted by the following persons:

- students or graduates who have either successfully completed or are enrolled for the Fourth Year of their Undergraduate studies in the case of degree courses which directly allow access to a Master's degree, e.g. Engineering, etc.;
- students who have either successfully completed or are enrolled for their BSc Honours but who have not yet enrolled for Master's studies;
- students or graduates who have, in their most recent two years of study, obtained an aggregate of at least 60% for their subjects;
- Students who wish to receive scholarships for Master's studies have to apply prior to commencement of their Master's studies
- South African citizens

Value of Scholarship for Master's Studies award and period of support:

- **R70 000** p.a. for 2 years

Supplementation:

- SANCOLD encourages institutions to supplement the scholarship-holders' income by assigning appropriate research and teaching tasks to them that will contribute to the progress of obtaining their respective degrees. Awardees will be allowed to undertake a maximum of twelve hours of teaching, tutorials, assistance or demonstration duties per week on average during the year of study. Scholarship-holders may not be employed on a part-time basis if their working hours exceed nine hours, during office hours, per week on average during the year of study. Scholarship-holders may not hold full-time salaried employment during the tenure of the scholarship.
- SANCOLD scholarships may be held concurrently with other bursaries or scholarships.

Applications:

A project proposal providing information about the proposed studies and research at the relevant institute and study leader must be included. This project proposal should be a maximum of 2 pages (Arial, 10pt font, 1.5 spaced). A cover letter with full curriculum vitae, study record with marks, and the names of two references must be submitted to the Secretary: SANCOLD, PO Box 3404, PRETORIA, South Africa, 0001.
