SANCOLD Annual Conference and AGM 2018:

The Annual South African Committee on Large Dams (SANCOLD) Conference 2018 is to be held from Wednesday 7 to Friday 9 November 2018 at the NH Cape Town Lord Charles Hotel in Somerset West in the Western Cape.

The Conference theme is: "Sustainable dam engineering in an ever changing world." We are looking forward to some lively discussion around some 60+ papers for which abstracts have been accepted and will be submitted for the two days of conference. There will be a full programme which includes a social evening for the Young Persons' Forum, the SANCOLD AGM and the Conference Dinner. The third day is devoted to site visits of either earthfill embankments under construction or swelling of concrete due to chemical reaction.

Up to 3 CPD points are available depending on attendance.


SANCOLD Financial Support for post graduate studies:

SANCOLD has identified the urgent need to update the data and methods used for design flood estimation in South Africa and has initiated a National Flood Studies Programme (NFSP) to update these. To advance this programme, SANCOLD is proud to announce that it has provided for 2018, financial support of R45 000 to each of three students whose research links into furthering this programme.

This financial support was provided to Nkosinathi Dlamini whose study proposal is "Apply and assess a Joint Probability event based approach to design flood estimation for South African catchments", Nkululeko Mabila whose research proposal is "Assess the performance of selected simple Continuous Simulation Modelling approaches for Design Flood Estimation in South Africa" and Keanu Singh whose research proposal is "An assessment of data quality and availability on the estimation of design floods in South Africa".



<u>Free ICOLD Publications</u> <u>for SANCOLD Members: Revised</u> Password System

ICOLD took a decision in 2009 regarding easier (and cheaper) dissemination publications. This has been done via the revamped **ICOLD** website (www.icoldcigb.net). The ICOLD Central Office informed SANCOLD that it has changed the password system. Each user will be registered on the system in terms of their e-mail address and a unique personal password which is chosen by the individual. The personal password now gives such members access to all of the restricted sections of the ICOLD website. It allows access to the Members' Section on the website and also for free downloading of ICOLD Bulletins (reports). Any paid-up SANCOLD member (Corporate or Individual) who requires this access must first apply to the SANCOLD Secretary for the password to be able to register on the system.
